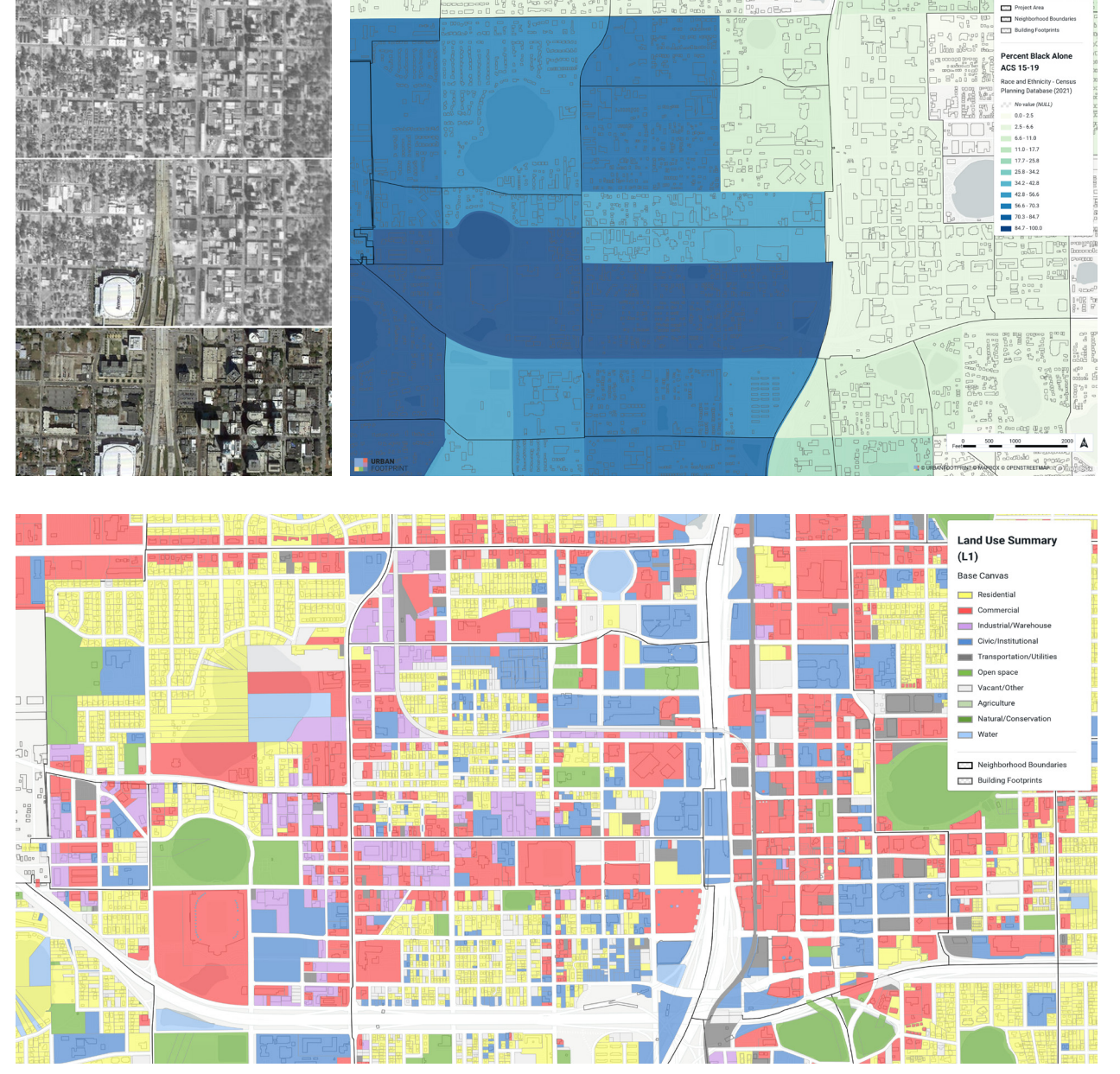

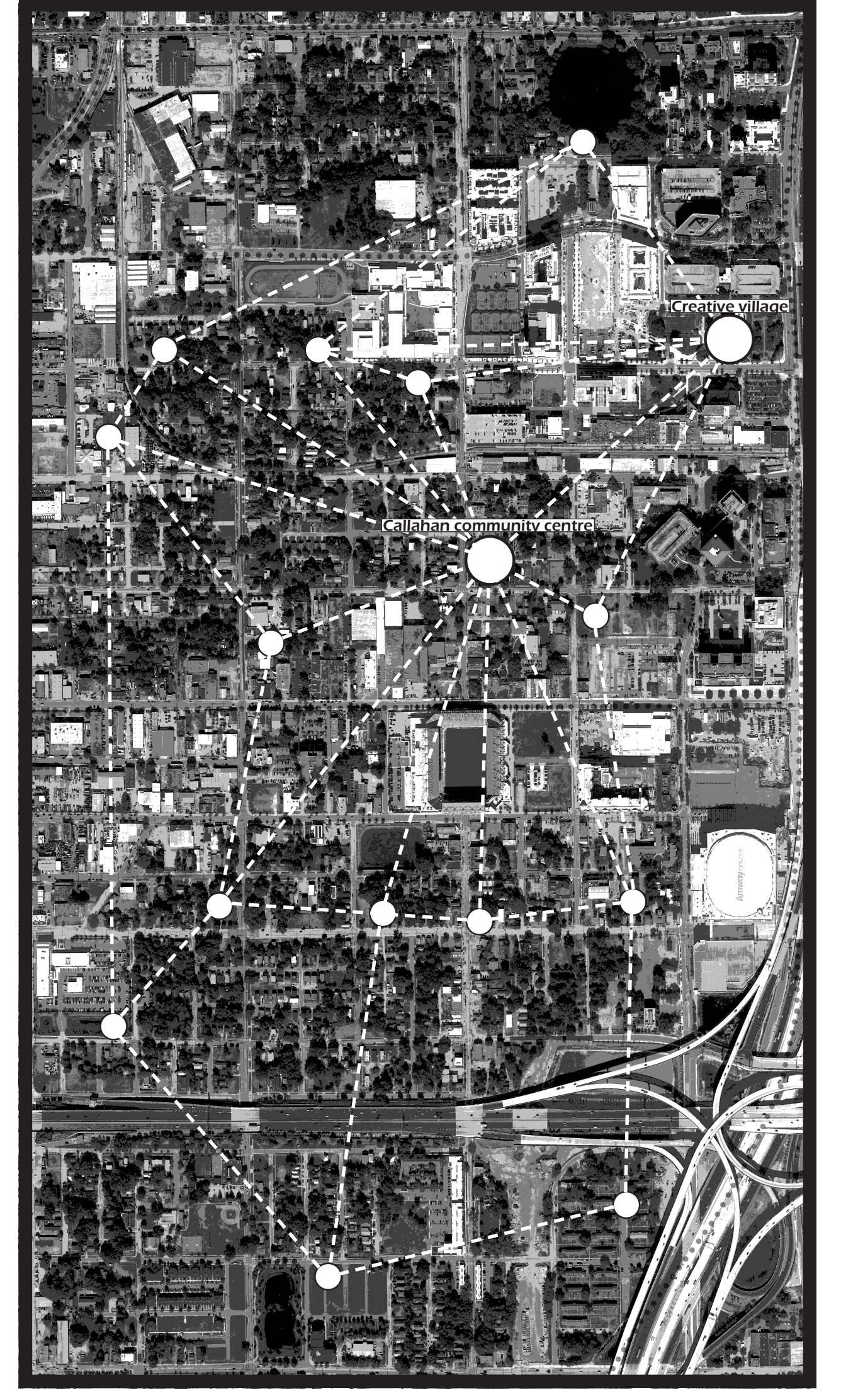

**THE HANKINS BUILDING**  
 Dr. I.S. Hankins constructed this Art Deco commercial building in 1947. The Hankins building was one of the first buildings for Black professionals in Orlando. It is the only Art Moderne commercial building in the historic district from the mid 1930's.

Did you know your grandpa owned this building?

**Dr. I.S. Hankins**  
 Dr. I. Sylvester Hankins was born in Orlando in 1895. Dr. Hankins was an early African American physician and a key civic leader advocating for equal opportunity and fair treatment for blacks.

While the building first served as a location for black doctors and lawyers, it has seen many uses throughout its years: a tailor, a dentist, NAACP chapter meetings, and currently a florist.

He helped to integrate city schools!

There's a park named after him!

He fostered the construction of homes for blacks!

Dr. H paved the way for others. A true role model!

Dr. H was a member of the NAACP!

According to local community members, unshowered individuals house in the east of Lake Dot, Parramore, and Calhoun.

Mom, did you see you're not a doctor?

Redevelopment can create new avenues for revitalization and a connection to impoverished neighborhoods, on a health and social level. Despite the growing number of **unhoused individuals** that reside in neighborhoods such as Lake Dot, advocacy and capacity for intervention can focus on the factors that successfully address ideas of **safety and security for families and children** in the redeveloping area.

The median income is less than \$35,000 and 86% of families run out of money each month.
